## This is the MARA repeater, W8USA

On January 12, 2001 at 5:10 PM, a dream that started 6 years before, became a reality. Our club put on the air, it's very own repeater. But not just a repeater. We have what might be the only completely brand new repeater any club in Michigan has ever, till now, put on the air. This has not been an easy road to travel. We gave up our summers so we could operate the coffee stop, we increased our club dues and some of us volunteered to learn more about repeaters, just so we could finish what the club started. As of this past Memorial Day weekend, the repeater, with its' brand new, Hi-Tech Controller, is fully operational. We are testing OUR understanding of how to operate a repeater, but for the most part, the Machine is working. We have moved the location, which will explain why its signal has changed, and in some cases, dropped right off. Presently, it's on the North East Side of the city and is running 25 watts while we become familiar with operating it. The present location is ideal for the testing, and setting up of the repeater. No long and repeated drives over to the repeater site: it's accessible within 3 feet of our new club trustee. We are, however, searching for a new location, but may still utilize our old NW site. The old site needs oodles of work and a new antenna support structure would be required. While the search continues, the features of the new controller and repeater are being tested and learned by our repeater team. We are dividing up the responsibilities of maintaining the repeater into several groups. If you're interested, please let the board know . Some of you have been aware that our club has gone through "difficulties" in achieving this goal. That is over now. Our whole clubs goal right now, is how to get more people involved with 1. Field Day 2001 2. Ham Radio in general and 3. just have fun with our friends!

On March 12, 2001 MARA received a ruling from the Michigan Area Repeater Council stating that " Since the sponsor of the coordinated frequency was transferred to MARA, and we did not receive any paper work from MARA relinquishing the frequency to 541 INC., MARC Inc reverses its earlier ruling and recognizes MARA to be the holder of the coordination of 145.410 frequency". This ended a long and agonizing dispute over the coordination. I would like to take this opportunity to thank those who supported MARA throughout this ordeal. I think we all have learned some very important lessons from this and hopefully now we can proceed with our other business agenda. The repeater we have on line is very basic and we will need to

make some improvements as time and finances permit. We are planning to add a new controller in the near future, which will increase the capabilities of our repeater tremendously. We are currently running an output of 25 watts and in the future we may have to take a look at increasing that output. As you all know, the coffee stops provide necessary funding for club projects. Obviously we need volunteers to work the coffee stops. If this sounds like a solicitation that's because it is. Please look at your schedules and see if you can find four hours to devote to working a shift at the coffee stops during the summer months. The benefits derived from your efforts will be yours. The MARA website has a link (Operation Care) on which you can put your name down for a time slot of your choice. Its not too early to volunteer, in fact now you can pretty much pick and choose. Please consider helping your

club and the community.
