And if we want unity, then we will treat our fellow hams like brothers. I take that back, we will treat them better than brothers; we will treat them like friends. If we want unity, we will be careful of what we say on the air, for the airwaves are public. If we want unity, we will try to not damage or offend any person or group. Please, let's all strive for unity.

Welcome New Generals

Amateur Radio gained many new Generals back in the year 2000, when the code requirement was dropped from 13 wpm down to 5 wpm. Now, it is possible that we may gain even more Generals, with the complete removal of the international requirement for Morse Code, which actually occurred almost a year ago. Individual countries may still require code proficiency, if they wish.

Since the removal of the international requirement, over a dozen petitions have been submitted to the FCC regarding licensing changes, and they are all very different. Recently, the ARRL submitted a proposal, followed by a proposal submitted by the Radio Amateur Foundation, of which our own Chuck W8VOM was one of the six signers. There may be dozens of them before it's over.

With all the hype and commotion caused by these many petitions, it is easy to forget that the FCC makes the rules. They could even choose to do nothing, and just leave things the way they are.

If the FCC adopts the ARRL petition, 200,000 Technicians would get an automatic promotion to a General class license.

If the FCC is waiting for a consensus from the Amateur community, change may be in the distant future. It wouldn't surprise me if well-heeled Amateur groups were to file lawsuits against the FCC, and then we'd have the judicial system involved, also.

Whatever the case, it will be interesting to see what action, if any, the FCC takes.

2004 MICHIGAN QSO PARTY

Attention Michigan Amateurs. Spring is here and it's time for the Michigan QSO Party. This is a great opportunity to get on the HF bands, have some fun, and represent the great State of Michigan. The organizers of this event would like to see as many Michigan stations on the air as possible. It is the activity of the Michigan stations that will make this event a success. This event, like other state QSO parties has seen an increase in activity in recent years. Last year, the number of MIQP logs submitted were up by 69% and the total qso count was up by 27%. The MIQP is getting bigger and better every year. With the continued support of those that have discovered the fun and the addition of some new blood, the MIQP will continue to grow. It is now considered one of the better qso parties in the country.

As you can see from the rules listed below, this is only a 12 hour event. Please consider getting on the air for the whole thing, or any portion of the 12 hour period. You can operate from home, portable, or mobile. We again, with the support of mobile stations plan on having some activity in all 83 counties.

How about making this a club event? You can submit your individual or multi-op scores under the name of the your club and maybe bring home the club plaque. Hey, why not challenge another local area club or other groups within your club? Are there others in your club that would consider a mini expedition for a portable operation in one of the Michigan counties with minimal activity?? Those of you that have been in the QSO Party, please help us get the word out and encourage other Michigander hams to participate and join the fun. The name of the game is to have fun and make Michigan "Radio Active" on April 17th. Hope to hear you on the air!

Date /Time: Michigan QSO Party, sponsored by the Mad River Radio Club, from 1600Z April 17th until 0400Z April 18th. Stations may operate the full 12 hours. (12 noon to 12 midnight local Michigan time on April 17)

Modes and Categories: Phone and CW on 80/40/20/15/10 meters. Single-op, multi-op, and mobile categories. Single-op entries are categorized by output power, QRP (5W or less), Low Power (100W or less), and High Power (greater than 100W)

Multipliers: Work stations once per band and mode. Work other states and Michigan Stations.

Work portables and mobiles again as they change county, state or province.

Exchange: Exchange QSO number and location (county for MI stations, state/province or "DX" for others).

Freqs: Suggested frequencies: CW-3545, 7045, 14045, 21045, 28045;
Phone-3850, 7225, 14250, 21300, 28450.

Scoring: One point per phone QSO, two points per CW QSO. Count multipliers once per mode. Multipliers are MI counties for all entries, plus states & provinces for MI entries only. Final score is total QSO points times total multipliers.

Log Submittal: Mail logs no later than 30 days after the contest to:

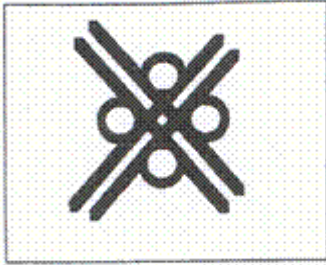
Our Club Members

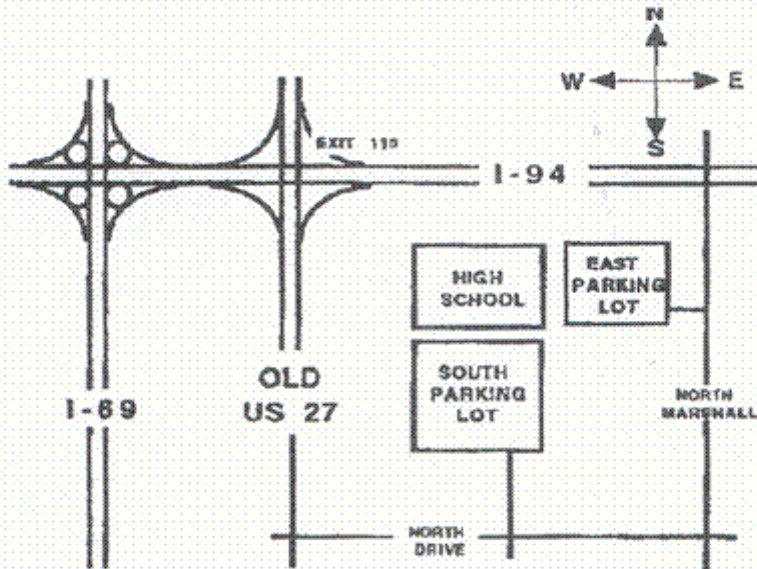
