He donated many hours to the Wexford-Missaukee Radio Club.

Glen, while not a licensed ham, has touched the lives of just about every ham in Michigan. He's the one the W8HVG Link system hired to do tower work on the link system, when they needed an expert. Other ham radio clubs also called the Tower Man, when they needed professional work done. Installing antennas, changing aircraft warning lights, and stringing coax. We at Mara got the pleasure of seeing this professional man at work when he installed our new antenna. Glen made the work look easy! He was a true professional and a great friend. He will be missed.

## Attention Dxers

I have been noticing for quite sometime on the DX clusters, spots of Russian stations showing what looked like grid squares. But the numbers did not match grid square maps and some show RDA in front of the numbers. I researched RDA and found out that it is the Russian version of our county award. It stands for Russian Districts Award. There are 2745 districts (counties) in 89 oblasts (similar to our states, I guess). I went through 10 years of logs starting on 12June91, the start date of the award. Found out that I had sent 422 QSL cards to Russia, mainly through the bureau system and only received 184 cards back. That is a measly 43.6%. Of the cards I have checked, less than half show their RDA. So unless I can find a website to look up RDAs, it will be many hours at the library looking up their districts just to confirm 100 districts for the basic award. Have you worked all of Switzerland's cantons yet???
